PROGRAM AT PARK OPEN TO PUBLIC

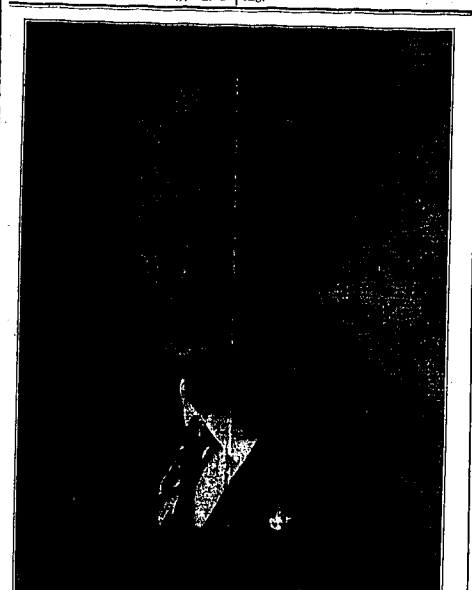
Conferring Degree of Chivalry Will Be Open Ceremony.

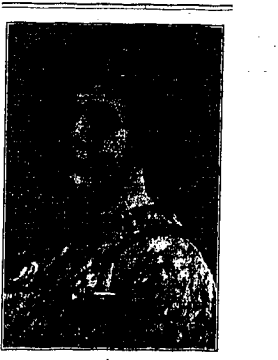
CUP GIVEN LEMHI

HONOR MEMORY OF BRAVE PIONEERS

Unwell Monument Near American Falls Where Indians Massacred Emigrants.

Sons and daughters of the pioneers who helped emblazon the nation's westward progress in Idaho gathered Sunday afternoon at Massacre Rocks, 12 miles west of American Falls on the Old Oregon Trail, for the unveiling of the monument commemorating the spot where an emigrant train was ambushed and massacred by Shoshone Indians on August 10, 1862.

Secretary Lukens paid tribute to the pioneers who always traveled onward and always westward. Little Blanche Zaring, granddaughter of Alva Zaring, the captain of the wagon train which arrived the next day and helped bury the dead, pulled the ribbons that removed the veil from the monument. Ezra Zaring, son of the pioneer, who was a boy three years of age in that wagon train, stood at the side of his niece.
