

# What The Tax-Payers' League of Washington County Stands For

## Laws That Can Be Enforced. The Enforcement of the Law. Lower Taxes.

The Tax-payers' League of Washington County desire it to be now and forever understood just what the position of its members is in regard to the conducting and managing of Saloons in this County in the event the people, by a majority, vote in favor of license, and we submit the following platform upon which the League stands.

"We are opposed to the granting of any license to any men except those of good moral character and habits."

We advocate regulating the number of saloons to one to each hotel and one outside of the hotels, and not more than one license to each one thousand inhabitants.

We advocate that every saloon be conducted in a quiet and orderly manner.

We advocate the prohibiting the sale of liquor to minors, or persons in an intoxicated condition and prohibiting minors from frequenting saloons.

We advocate not permitting the use of chairs or tables in any saloons or any curtains or stained glass, or slot machines or any gambling devices of any kind, or anything to prevent a clear view of the interior.

We advocate a license for conducting the retail liquor business in the City of Weiser of \$100.00 per month, payable in advance in addition to the present State and County license.

We advocate having the license of any dealer revoked and license money forfeited for any violation of these requirements upon complaint and conviction the first time.

We advocate that a copy of the City ordinance be placed in a conspicuous place in every retail liquor store in town and that all its provisions be rigidly enforced.

The League being composed of the heaviest Taxpayers of the County, has a personal interest in this matter and its members believe that they have sufficient assurance and influence to induce the passage of an ordinance that will carry into effect all these regulations.

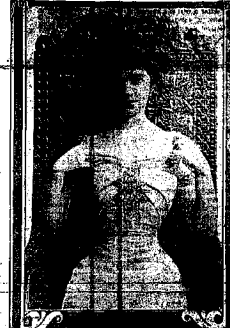

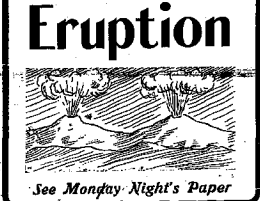

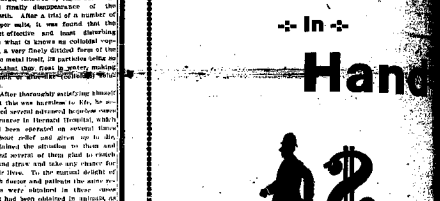
