In conducting the campaign for the city bonds it has been the desire of the city council and the committee to give the widest publicity to the facts and to appeal only to the good judgment and business sense of the voters.

The opposition to the street grading and sidewalks has been met by the city council in a pledge to the voters which practically wipes out half of the proposed debt except in such places as a majority of the people want the improvement.

The charge that \$85,000 is to be spent for a reservoir site has been answered by a statement from the council that here the site was selected Mr. Keller had promised them he would sell the city the land needed at exactly what it cost with interest for the time he has held it, and the price will not exceed \$500.

The \$85,000 covers every item of expense in connection with the extension of the water works.

er works, including doubling the capacity of the infiltration gallery, laying pipes so as to give water and fire protection to every part of the city, the new low pressure reservoir which will also furnish water for the cemetery and putting in new cast iron pipe of larger size and strength in the proposed paving district.

It has been conclusively shown that the saving in repairs and extensions, which have averaged more than \$8,000 a year, will pay the interest and also the full amount of the \$85,000 before it is due.

The argument that city taxes will be increased should they become a burden has been disproven by the figures. There is every reason to believe the estimates will be reduced at least 15% possibly 25 per cent. If we take it for granted they will not, if the cost is all the estimates call for the tax will not exceed \$3.25 a year on the \$7,000 valuation of the city.
