### IN DAYS OF OLD

75 YEARS AGO  
July 12, 1900

City Council of Weiser held a special meeting July 12, 1900. Mayor Anderson presided. Present were Galloway, Hitt, Dink, Kelly, and Trull.

A sprinkling district was set up for three months. Gallows moved a tax of 65 cents per foot on lots abutting the streets of the sprinkling district to be collected monthly at 50 cents for the first month and two cents for the next two months. Passed unanimously.

The chief of police was instructed to collect the sprinkling tax and turn it over to the city clerk.

Wm. Anderson was present and asked that the Council declare the Wilkinson and Thompson warehouse a public nuisance and remove it as it is "right smack in the street intersection of Livingston and Washington Sts. Motion made and passed that a writ be issued by the court to remove the warehouse.

The Board of Trade is studying the matter of an irrigation district by which the people could own and control their own water.

The secretary was authorized to procure 35 copies of the law.

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40 YEARS AGO  
July 18, 1935

Annual picnic of the Farmers Cooperative Association was held at the Railroad park at Ontario, July 13. A large crowd is expected to bring their basket lunches and enjoy the free ice cream and coffee served by the creamery.
