Muddy Water, Fish Don't Mix

Muddy water and fish do not mix. Anything that gets into the water usually is the loser unless it can find some source of clear water.

Wall Butkko, fish hatcheries supervisor at the Department of Fish and Game, said prolonged periods of rain will cause the water to become turbid and the fish will die of suffocation.

"Muddy water is not to be used for fish raising," said the fish's food supply is either carried away by the flood or it is covered over the food supply, he said.

The settling of silt over fish eggs also can cut off oxygen to the eggs and reduce the eggs to smother before the water clears up again, he said.
