DESCRIPTIONS OF CONVICTS

The descriptions are made out in duplicate and are exchanged with other jurisdictions. The exact measurements of the bodies of the prisoners are taken. Finger prints furnish one of the many means of identification. The equipment is provided with a camera, which, when properly focused, will take a photograph of a person on an accurate scale. This feature is considered valuable in comparison of the photographs and descriptions.

The prisoners at the penitentiary will each be placed up when the installation of the apparatus is complete and their descriptions will be carefully secured. Duplicate descriptions will also be taken. It is the latest state in the northwest to adopt the system of identification—Boise Statesman.

THESE MUST BE REMOVED

City Council Votes Out Trees Which Interfere With Street Improvement—Must Be Taken Out.

At the regular meeting of the city council last Monday, Sept. 27, some matters of importance were transacted, one of which was the notice to the chief of police that he serve notice on all property owners who have trees which stand in the way of the proposed street improvement that they must remove the trees. It was also specified that the property owners be given 15 days to complete the work.

A motion was passed that the mayor be empowered to appoint not more than two cement inspectors at a salary of three dollars a day.

Several petitions were presented to the council but no action was taken on any of them favorably. The council voted to allow H. E. Tobera, Wesner, Milton, G. F. Dickerson and J. D. G. to use scales in front of their respective places of business to be placed according to the health department.

The matter of remodeling and changing the inefficient lines from the streets to the alley was referred to the water and light committee to report at the next meeting and submit recommendations concerning the change.

Council then adjourned to meet Wednesday evening, October 2.

LEARNED THE LESSON

Then the Ignorant Spread the Glad Greeting Broadcast. Some experience of the first days of school-teaching in the Philippines are described by Alice M. Kelly in the Ignorant in November, 1901, so that she can really be considered a veteran.

The natives were frightened at the sight of an American woman, and not even cricket-studies, the scold could bring them to bay. They spoke no English or Spanish, and she had no words of their own.

But she resolved to break this silence, and, watching one old man who could not run, she repeated over and over again, "Good morning, Mrs. Kelly," till, at last, in course, he repeated the words after her. "Not long after she heard that Americans were being treated, regardless of sex, with a civility that was surprising, Mrs. Kelly."

And she went on in a courtroom several openings suddenly, walked up to the judge's bench and, bowing deeply, said, "Good morning, Mrs. Kelly," evidently well satisfied that they had done the correct thing.

The school which Mrs. Kelly founded has become the best school.

A new system of identification of criminals, which is being tested in the northwest, has been adopted at the Idaho state penitentiary. The system is known as the "Finger Print" system.
