Indianhead Good Sams

On Monday, Nov. 11, nineteen members of the Indianhead Good Sam Club, together with eight guests, took a potluck dinner to Payette, where they visited The Kilm.

The building is located where the old saw mill used to be on Washoe Road southwest of Payette. Because lumber was dried here, it was known as The Kilm and the name has been retained by Chuck Kinney, who has remodeled it into a true potter's paradise, complete with the clay, potters' wheels, unfinished articles, and finished pieces.

Chuck and Diane Kinney were on hand to give the Good Sams group a tour while explaining what is known as the Raku process of pottery making. Pieces of pottery were taken out of an oven where they had been heated to 1,800 degrees. Upon removal they were placed into garbage cans containing burning straw, to reduce the heat to 150 degrees.

After cooling, a variety of colors were evident. These had resulted from the glaze used or from leaving bare clay showing (and it's impossible to predict the color you'll end up with).

A trip up a flight of stairs took us to the loft, where Lynda Smith of Ontario was using a potter's wheel and showed us how to make

two different types of pots: the first one like a vase, the second fluted and appearing more like a serving dish. These were made from the raw clay, and would be allowed to dry for about a week before being glazed and placed in the oven.

There were many types of articles on display around the loft and a few pieces were for sale. Our trip provided us some interesting insights to a challenging hobby.

Everyone enjoyed a potluck dinner at noon, and immediately after the meal the new president, Truman Newbury, called the meeting to order.

Sunshine Committee reported that Nell Guiver was still in the hospital, Val Emmons had recently had cataract surgery, and Cora Hixon is recuperating from surgery.

The president reported that Jack Olney will be installed as the new State Director.

A new Calling Committee was appointed.

The next regular meeting of the Good Sams will be held Monday, Dec. 9, with a potluck dinner at 6 p.m. at the Community Center.

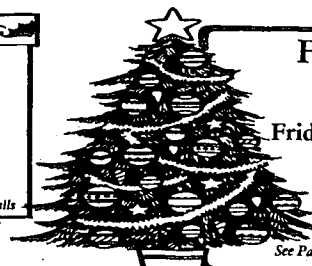

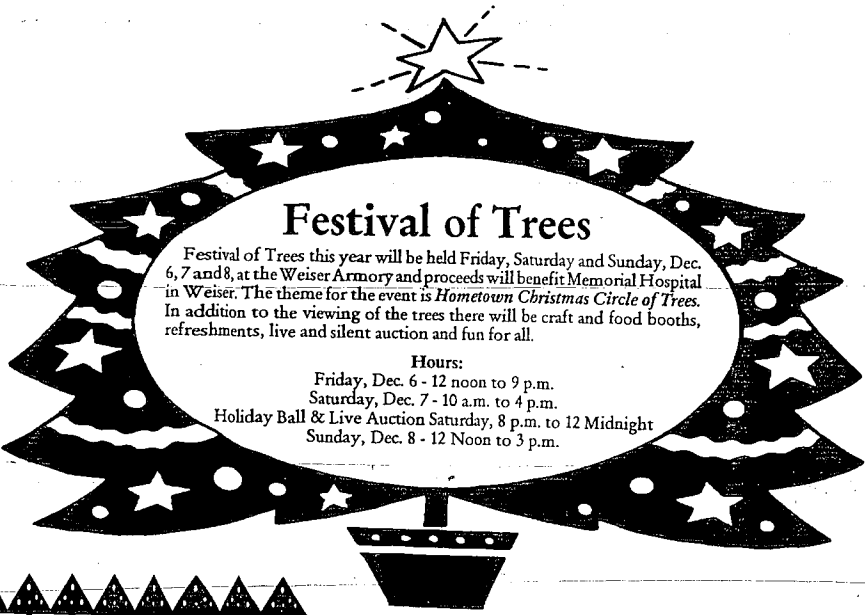

Buttermilk/Eggnog Bread

1 tsp. vanilla or rum extract
Mix the following dry ingredients sifted together alternately with 1 1/4 cup buttermilk or eggnog into the creamed mixture:

3 cups flour
1 1/2 tsp. baking powder
1/2 tsp soda
1 tsp salt

Grease two bread pans and use a cinnamon and sugar mixture instead of flour to cover the grease. Fill pans 1/3 full of batter. Sprinkle with cinnamon and sugar mixture and chopped walnuts or pecans. Put more batter on top, careful not to overfill to allow for rising. Sprinkle more sugar and cinnamon on top and additional chopped nuts. Pat the nuts down into the dough just a bit. Bake at 325 degrees for 35 to 50 minutes. If browning too fast on top, cover with foil and continue baking until done clear through.

The origin of Christmas kettles

The Salvation Army food? Captain in San Francisco had resolved, in December of 1891, to provide a free Christmas dinner to the area's poor persons. But how would he pay for the

the Stage Landing he saw a large pot, called "Simpson's pot" into which charitable donations were thrown by passers-by. On the next morning, he secured permission from the authorities to place a similar pot at the Oakland ferry landing, at the foot of Market Street. No time was lost in securing the pot and placing it in a conspicuous position, so that

it could be seen by all those going to and from the ferry boats. In addition, a brass urn was placed on a stand in the waiting room for the same purpose. Thus, Captain Joseph McFee launched a tradition that has spread not only throughout the United States, but throughout the world.

By Christmas, 1895, the kettle was used in 30 Salvation Army Corps in various sections of the West Coast area. *The Sacramento Bee* of that year carried a description of the Army's Christmas activities and mentioned the contribution throughout the United States, but throughout the world. Shortly afterward, two young Salvation Army officers who had been instrumental in the original use of the kettle, William A. McIntyre and N.J. Lewis, were transferred to the East. They took with them the idea of the Christmas kettle. In 1897, McIntyre prepared his Christmas plans

for Boston around the kettle, but his fellow officers refused to cooperate for fear of "making spectacles of themselves." So McIntyre, his wife and his sister set up three kettles at the Washington Street thoroughfare in the heart of the city. That year the kettle effort in Boston and other locations nationwide re-

sulted in 150,000 Christmas dinners for the needy. In 1898, the *New York World* hailed The Salvation Army kettles as "the newest and most novel device for collecting money." The newspaper also observed, "There is a man in charge to see that contributions are not stolen." In 1901, kettle contributions in New York City

provided funds for the first mammoth sit-down dinner in Madison Square Garden, a custom that continued for many years. Today, however, families are given grocery checks so that they can buy and prepare their own dinners at home. The homeless poor are still invited to share holiday dinners and festivities at hundreds of Salvation Army centers.

Kettles now are used in such distant lands as Korea, Japan, and Chile, and in many European countries. Everywhere, public contributions to the kettles enable The Salvation Army to bring the spirit of Christmas to those who would otherwise be forgotten - to the aged and lonely, the ill, the inmates of jails and other institutions, the poor and unfortunate. In the United States, The Salvation Army annually aids more than 7,500,000 persons at Thanksgiving and Christmas. Kettles have changed since the first utilitarian cauldron set up in San Francisco. Some of the new kettles have such devices as a self-ringing bell and a booth complete with public address system over which the traditional Christmas carols are broadcast. Behind it all, though, is the same Salvation Army message, "Sharing Is Caring."

apple, Drained
1/2 Cup Pecans, Chopped
ICING:
1/2 Cup (1 Stick) Unsalted Butter, at Room Temp.
8 Oz. Cream Cheese, at Room Temp.
2 Tsp. Vanilla Extract
1 1/2-Oz. Box Confectioners' Sugar, Sifted.
TO MAKE CAKE: Pre-heat oven to 350 degrees F. Grease and flour three 8-inch round cake pans.

Sift the dry ingredients into a large bowl. Add the eggs and vegetable oil, and stir until well blended. Fold in the carrots, pineapple, and pecans, stirring until thoroughly blended. Pour one-third of the batter into each pan. Bake for 30 minutes or until a toothpick inserted into the center comes out clean. Cool the cakes in the pans for 15 minutes, then remove from pans and

let cool completely on wire racks.
TO MAKE THE ICING: Place butter and cream cheese in a large bowl. Using an electric mixer set at medium speed, cream the butter and cream cheese until light and fluffy. Add the vanilla. Reduce the speed to low and then gradually beat in the confectioners' sugar until the mixture is smooth. Frost the cake.
