ASSEMBLED IN THE WEST

Many Eastern Capitalists Gather At Weiser--Stockholders and Directors Of Iron Springs Mines Hold Important Meeting

Probably the most notable gathering of men interested in mining that has taken place in Idaho this year was the meeting of the stockholders and directors of the Iron Springs Consolidated Mining Company, which was held at Weiser, Idaho, on Wednesday and Thursday, August 3 and 4.

The meeting was held in the Hotel Weiser, and was attended by approximately 100 men, including many prominent capitalists from the East. The meeting was presided over by J. E. Nevin, president of the company, and J. H. Nevin, secretary.

The main business of the meeting was the election of a new board of directors for the coming year. The following were elected:

- President—J. E. Nevin
- First vice-president—J. H. Nevin
- Second vice-president—J. E. Nevin
- Secretary—W. P. Hovey

The meeting also heard reports from the directors on the operations of the company during the past year. It was stated that the company had produced a net profit of \$100,000 for the year ending June 30, 1905. The meeting also discussed the proposed extension of the railroad to Weiser, and the possibility of developing other mining properties in the district.

BUILD A RESERVOIR

Plans That Will Insure Ample Supply of Water for Irrigation--Bitch Cases Comprised

The low water in the river and streams, with a consequent lack of water for irrigation purposes, has caused the various ditch companies to make plans for a reservoir site which will insure the water of the Weiser during the dry season. More than 20,000 acres of land are being irrigated by the water of the Weiser. The high water in the river is at least 100 feet above the level of the Weiser during the dry season. A special reservoir site has been located at Lost Valley to hold the water of the Lost Valley of the Weiser. A dam 100 feet high will be built on the site, and will hold water 100 feet high and one and a half miles wide and 22 feet deep. It is estimated that this reservoir would furnish 10,000 inches of water for 100 days. The reservoir would be constructed at a cost of \$10,000 to \$15,000. The site for which has been filed on the Weiser Irrigation district. It is intended to issue bonds for the construction of the reservoir, and to be commenced next year and completed in time to be ready for the following year.

Another reason for the building of this dam by the Weiser Irrigation district was caused by the Jefferson ditch being an objection to the canal for taking out some 250 inches of water claimed by the Jefferson ditch people to be one dam. A company was organized during the month of June to build a dam on the Jefferson ditch. An effort was made to dissolve the corporation, but it was refused by Judge Smith. The Jefferson ditch will now go to court and sue the Jefferson ditch and the Weiser Irrigation district for the water right on the river.
